
- Providing 24/7 coverage for the numbers of Notifications/Interviews/Visits/21 day Telephone Monitoring/Documentation this new mandate requires.
- 2. New policies, temperature logs, form letters, ledgers, replacement phones and thermometers, and Ebola time sheets are the new face of CD.

Low Risk Monitoring Challenges

- Numbers of travelers and sporadic arrivals
- Accuracy of Initial Notification Information
- Compliance in Availability
- Language Barriers
- Cultural and Religious Barriers
- Sick Visits During Monitoring Period
- Pregnancy and Delivery during Monitoring Period
- Interstate and Intrastate Travel and Notifications
- School Enrollment During Monitoring Period

Mecklenburg Experience

- October 10, 2014 April 2, 2015
- Total 133 travelers (119 adults and 14 minors)
- Low risk = 131, some risk = 1, no risk = 1
- Asymptomatic = 133, symptomatic = 0
- Nine children entered school
- Average caseload = 16.6
