About the Course

Prior to the start of the course, participants complete an on-line pre-course assessment. Following completion of the pre-course assessment, the participant begins Modules 1-3. After the completion of Modules 1-3 the participant will notify the course coordinator, Phyllis Rocco at phyllis.rocco@dhhs.nc.gov. Each participant will receive a link to the on-line post course assessment. Participants are required to achieve a passing score of 80% to obtain credit for this component of the course. If the participant is unable to achieve the passing score on the first attempt, a second testing opportunity will be offered in 30 days after consulting with the Regional Nurse Consultant for your county. Should the second attempt to pass the test be unsuccessful, the Regional Nurse Consultant, your direct supervisor and the Technical Assistance and Training Program Supervisor will explore other options to substantiating the learning process. Contact hours will only be awarded only after the completion of the course work, tests and course evaluation.
