## **Priorities for HIV Care**

- Link to medical care and supportive services
   Assure attendance at first appointment
- Link to medication or resources
   ADAP, PAPs
- Return to care
  •Bridge counselors reaching out

## Care = Prevention

- Recent UNC study 052: HIV medication reduces transmission by 96%
- Uviral loads, CD4s = people less able to transmit virus to partners
- · Targeted testing for at-risk people
- Identifying the 19% who are "unaware"
   -7,000 in NC are unaware they are HIV+
- Stat treatment for acute infections
   Reduces unknowing transmission
