Submission Instructions

- 1. Place tick in a water-tight container (e.g. Ziploc bag or plastic vial) with a paper towel/cotton ball doused with alcohol to prevent desiccation.
- 2. Seal the Ziploc to prevent leakage.
- 3. Fill out specimen submission form (above) for each submission and attach with specimen(s). Each animal host should have its own submission form.
- 4. Cut and keep these instructions.
- 5. Package specimen(s) and the submission form(s) carefully to avoid damage during shipment.
- 6. Use the prepaid postage envelopes provided for specimens in Ziploc bags or plastic vials. For larger containers, please mail them to:
