
## **Directions to Mine:**


This deposit is located on the south side of Coldsides Mountain, 5.5 miles south of Cashiers and 2.0 miles northwest of where State Highway 107 crosses into South Carolina. The mine can be reached by traveling on State Highway 107 for 6.95 miles south of its intersection with U. S. Highway 64 at Cashiers. Turn west onto SR 1100(Bull Pen Road) and travel 1.45 miles to a logging road on the north side of SR 1100. Follow the logging road for 0.2 mile to where it crosses Licklog Creek. From this point walk in a west to southwesterly direction for about 850 feet to where the logging road bifurcates. Follow the North fork up the ridge for about 0.5 mile to the mine.
